3 - If online, please describe what course content was successfully delivered in online formats, as well as the online teaching practices that contributed positively to your learning experiences.



- Lectures, readings, and supplementary material was all delivered each week. I really felt that the in class discussions, and discussion posts engaged me with the material.
- We were partly asynchronous as all lectures were prerecorded. But our weekly discussions were helpful in figuring out how to apply the knowledge. Pretty much everything he discussed was suited to online format. it translated really well into the online format.
- I liked the way the class was set up with the synchronous and asynchronous elements. I don't think the online elements were overwhelming and are a reasonable amount of time. I think the readings were a bit too time-consuming and I wish we were given more help on the essays.
- I think the course slides and lecture videos were really successfully. And it's really helpful whenever we need to go back to review all the materials.
- Daniel did a very successful job making all of the information (including readings, lectures, and other various assignments) available to his students on canvas. By setting each week up into different modules helped me to stay on task with assignments and finish things in a timely manner. As much as I would have liked this class to have been in person, Daniel did a fabulous job with the transition to online learning.
- lectures that were posted covered the readings thoroughly and gave a good point to have a discussion during zoom meetings. the texts were informative but sometimes dense in ethical theory that made it a little hard to finish, but all that didn't make sense was covered in the pre-recorded lectures. discussion posting/ posting to the discussion rooms every week was a lot to keep up with at times, especially when some readings and lectures were long. I would spend about 3 hours doing readings and lectures before I got to the discussion posts.

[•] class discussions during zoom meetings were very informative and eye-opening


